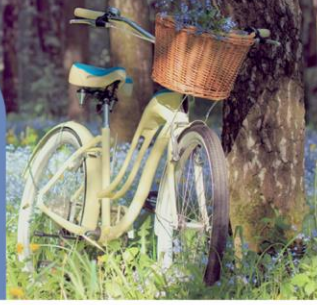

Tulip Time is almost here! Did you know that it is celebrating?

95th Anniversary!

In case you didn't know; here is a little bit of history!

The idea of Tulip Time was introduced in 1927 at a Woman's Literary Club meeting. Miss Lida Rogers, a biology teacher at Holland High School, suggested that Holland adopt the tulip as it's flower because of it's close ties to the Netherlands, and set aside a day for a festival.

In 1928, City Council, under Mayor Ernest C. Brooks, appropriated funds to purchase 100,00 tulip bulbs from the Netherlands. These bulbs were planted in city parks & other areas. Thus, it was in 1929 that thousands of tulips bloomed, and Holland invited visitors to come during a week in May. Because of interest shown, it was decided to make Tulip Time an annual event.
